WHEN TRAVELING THROUGH HIGH ALPINE ENVIRONMENTS

VEHICLE TRAVEL		Stay on designated routes
PARKING		Designated parking only
CAMPING		No tents on tundra Stay in designated campsites above treeline
FOOT TRAVEL		Minimize travel off established routes

Colorado OHV Registration requirements: All OHVs owned and operated in Colorado (including motor vehicles and motorcycles that are not licensed for public road access) must display current Colorado OHV registration stickers when in a person's possession within, or operated on, any public lands in Colorado.

Colorado OHV Use Permit requirements: All OHVs and motor vehicles (including motorcycles) that display a valid Colorado or out-of-state license plate must also display a current Colorado OHV use permit sticker when operated on any designated OHV trails in Colorado.

All out of state OHVs (including OHVs that display an out of state OHV registration) must also display a current Colorado OHV use permit sticker when operated on any public lands in Colorado. Registration information available at staythetrail.org and cpw.state.co.us

Many roads and trails may cross or border private land. Colorado does not require private land to be posted. Please stay on trail to avoid trespassing in these areas.

Spark Arrestors

Forest Service approved spark arrestors are required on ALL public lands.

Traveling off trail or designated routes is a ticketable offense and is not allowed under any circumstances. It's not only irresponsible, it's illegal.
