Seep Springs



Seep Springs Recreation Area provides Off-Highway-Vehicle recreational opportunities with an emphasis on trail widths 50" or less for ATVs, motorcycles, hiking, and horseback riding. Sixteen miles of roads and trails wind through piñon pine and juniper woodlands on BLM public lands. The area may be closed at a wet weather gate to motorized use during wet conditions. - Traveling off trail or designated routes is a ticketable offense and is not allowed under any circumstances. It's not only irresponsible, it's illegal.
- Many designated routes and trails may cross or border private land. Colorado does not require private land to be posted. Please stay on trail to avoid trespassing in these areas.
- Approved spark arrestors are required on ALL public lands.

Be courteous, safe and a good steward for Colorado's OHV community. Remember, they're called *recreational* vehicles for a reason, so...



- Know Your Width -----

ATV trails are open to vehicles with a width — wheel to wheel of 50 inches or less. Wider vehicles are limited to system roads only.

Your vehicle should not be wider than the route!







In state or out-of-state OHVs, this applies to you.

Before your adventure begins, familiarize yourself with Colorado's Off-Highway Vehicle Program to ensure your safety and enjoyment as a responsible rider. Vehicle registrations, renewals and out-of-state vehicle permits fund trail maintenance and construction, trailheads, parking areas, trail signs, maps, and land acquisition.
