Share The Trail

We share these trails with all types of user groups. Off Highway Vehicles (OHVs) should yield the "right of way" to non-motorized trail users, and each type may require its own special consideration.



CAUTION

BURNED AREA

Potential Hazards Include:

- Loose Rocks, Flash Flooding, and Debris Flows**
- Trees may have been weakened from fire damage and may fall at any time.
- Avoid area during high winds
- Be alert for falling trees
- Do not linger around large burned trees

Flash floods and debris flows may occur anytime.

- Avoid area during heavy rain
- Seek high ground immediately during flood

- The Danner Pass and Lookout Mountain Trails were greatly damaged by the Cameron Peak Fire in 2020 and subsequent flood events.
- The Canyon Lakes Ranger District, partners, and volunteers were able to reconstruct these trails with the help of Colorado Parks and Wildlife Off-Highway Vehicle Grant Funds.
- These trails are technically challenging and should only be used by experienced riders.
- This trail system serves as one of the only motorized singletrack opportunities on the Northern Front Range. You can help to keep these trails open by riding safely, respecting private property and other trail users, obtaining your CPW OHV registration, and obeying all rules and regulations.

Pipe Down! It's The Law

To operate a off-highway motorcycle in Colorado, the following sound limits must be met:

- 96dB(A) if manufactured after 1/1/1998
- 99dB(A) if manufactured before 1/1/1998

GET YOUR BIKE TESTED! Check with your dealership or visit the Stay The Trail trailer at select riding areas. Visit our website for dates and locations.

REMEMBER: Check you exhaust pipe, if it says "only for use in Closed Course Competition", it is not trail ready and will need modifications including a USFS approved spark arrestor.

STICK IT OR TICKET!

Colorado Off-Highway Vehicle Sticker **Required by Law**

In state or out-of-state OHVs, this applies to you.

Before your adventure begins, familiarize yourself with Colorado's Off-Highway Vehicle Program to ensure your safety and enjoyment as a responsible rider. Vehicle registrations, renewals and out-of-state vehicle permits fund trail maintenance and construction, trailheads, parking areas, trail signs, maps, and land acquisition.
